Thank you for your notification received on the 30th June 2023 in respect of the above consultation.

The Coal Authority is a non-departmental public body sponsored by the Department for Energy Security and Net Zero. As a statutory consultee, The Coal Authority has a duty to respond to planning applications and development plans in order to protect the public and the environment in mining areas.

Our records indicate that within the identified Neighbourhood Plan area there are recorded coal mining features present at surface and shallow depth including: mine entries, probable coal workings and reported surface hazards. These features may pose a potential risk to surface stability and public safety.

It does not appear that the Neighbourhood Plan proposes any new sites for development allocation and on this basis the Planning team at the Coal Authority have no specific comments to make on this document.
